YOUTH TOUR WINNER: LUKE ROYSTER OF DUNCOMBE



Luke Royster, a sophomore at St. Edmond Catholic School, has been selected as Prairie Energy Cooperative's Youth Tour contest winner. He will experience an educational-

filled week of adventure in Washington, D.C., alongside 1,900 students sponsored by electric cooperatives nationwide. This year's Youth Tour will be held June 17-23.

The Youth Tour was inspired in 1957 by Lyndon Johnson, then a U.S. senator from Texas. He called on electric cooperatives to send young people to Washington, "to see what the standing flag represents."

"I am excited to go on the lowa Youth Tour because I have always enjoyed learning U.S. history," says Royster. "I think it will be fun to see the sites that are so much a part of our history with a group of my peers. I am especially looking forward to going to Mount Vernon. George Washington played an integral role in establishing early U.S. history. I am looking forward to seeing his estate and walking the same grounds that he once walked."

The students will meet with state and federal legislators to get an up-close look at how our government works, along with experiencing the monuments, museums and history of our nation's capital.

It is critical that directors have an increased knowledge of changes in the electric utility business, new governance skills and a solid knowledge of the cooperative principles and business model. PECO has a commitment to work through our statewide association, the Iowa Association of Electric Cooperatives, to sharpen this body of knowledge for the benefit of our member-consumers.

The NRECA CCD program requires attendance and demonstrated understanding of the basic competencies contained in five core courses. These include director duties and liabilities, understanding the electric business, board operations and process, strategic planning and financial decision making.
