HONORING THE HEROES WHO KEEP THE LIGHTS ON

When storms rage and darkness falls, electric cooperative linemen answer the call. Their work is more than a job – it's a commitment to service, safety and resilience.

This dedication was on full display during Winter Storm Lola (photos below), which swept through Iowa early last month, bringing heavy snow, fierce winds and widespread power outages. With zero visibility and brutal conditions, linemen faced near-impossible challenges, navigating icy impassable roads, downed lines and blinding whiteouts. Yet, despite the dangers, they pressed on – working around the clock to restore power to homes, farms and businesses that depend on them.

As we approach Linemen Appreciation Day on April 14, Prairie Energy Cooperative takes this opportunity to recognize the crews who sacrifice so much to keep the lights on. It's easy to take electricity for granted – until it's gone. But behind every flipped switch and warm home stands a team of linemen who endure the worst so we can have the best.

To all our linemen, we extend our deepest gratitude. Your hard work, sacrifice and unwavering commitment do not go unnoticed. Thank you for weathering the storms so we don't have to.









OUTAGE ACTION PLAN: STAY SAFE, STAY INFORMED

At Prairie Energy Cooperative, we understand how frustrating outages can be. With the most recent winter storm, hundreds of members lost power for a prolonged period of time. While we work to restore power quickly and safely, here's what you can do to stay safe and informed.

Check your breakers. Ensure the outage isn't due to a tripped breaker in your home. Before you report an outage, reset your breaker and check if power is restored.

Report the outage. Call us at 800-722-0013 - our phones are answered 24/7 - or report outages through SmartHub. Even if others have reported the outage, additional reports help us pinpoint the issue. Do not report outages through social media or the "Contact Us" form on our website.

Stay informed. Follow our Facebook page for real-time outage updates and restoration efforts. Please do not use this as an avenue to report outages, as the page is not monitored 24/7.

Protect appliances. Unplug major electronics to prevent damage from power surges. Leave one light on to signal when power returns.



Keep food cold. Minimize fridge and freezer openings. A full freezer can keep food frozen for 48 hours if unopened.

Use generators safely. Operate generators outdoors, away from windows and doors. Never connect them directly to your home's electrical system.

Stay safe in severe weather. Remain indoors and have flashlights, a battery-powered radio and extra blankets ready.

Check on others. Look out for elderly or medically vulnerable neighbors and family members.

Conserve your phone battery. Use your phone only when necessary. Texting often works better than calling during widespread outages.

Be prepared. Keep an emergency kit with water, non-perishable food, flashlights and batteries.

Prairie Energy Cooperative (PECO) is a member-owned cooperative governed by a board of directors that you elect. As a member, one of your most important roles is to participate in the election of directors, and you can become more involved in your co-op by serving on that board.

Two positions on PECO's seven-member board of directors are open for election in 2025. The three-year terms of Allyn Waddingham, District 3, and Donald Christopherson, District 7 will expire.

Allyn Waddingham is running for another term unopposed, while the seat for District 7 remains open. Look for the annual report in next month's issue, which will include a 2024 year end review of your cooperative, including more information on the director election.
